'47 County Highway Budget \$185,000 Above This Year

A highway department budget estimated to be \$185,000 more than it was this year was submitted to the county board's finance committee Wednesday night for consideration with the 1947 budget. The highway department cautioned that the \$185,000 rise did not include a \$90,500 anticipated deficit for this year.

Items contributing to the deficit for 1946 are maintenance, snow removal, and grading, the department's statement showed. The 1947 request included \$157,490 for new equipment and about \$325,000 for road work including, resloping, ditching, surfacing, and seal coating.

In speaking for his portion of the highway department's budget, Traffic Capt. O. F. Larson said he expected a higher accident toll in 1947.
