

'Frankie' Claims Cary Wrong In Condemning Bobby-Soxers

Frank Sinatra will appear as guest on the Louella Parsons show, Sunday at 9:15 p. m. over ABC.

Sinatra, who recently received the Modern Screen award as the most popular actor in Hollywood, will defend the actions of the thousands of autograph seekers who have besieged him since he skyrocketed to fame a few years ago. Several weeks ago Cary Grant, other stars, as well as several name bands, will also take part in this program in support of the numerous local Community Chest drives. The 1946 campaigns were officially inaugurated by President Truman on Oct. 1.

A medley of Irving Berlin tunes is highlighted on the first Vaughn Monroe show to air over CBS at 7:30 p. m. Guest star will be Shirley Booth, comedienne.

"The Singular Adventure of the Stuttering Ghost" is the intriguing title of the first "Sherlock Holmes" story to be dramatized
