

Cleveland Symphony To Begin Concerts under George Szell

One of the outstanding musical organizations in America, the Cleveland Symphony orchestra, now under the direction of the celebrated composer-conductor, George Szell, will be presented by the Mutual network in a series of full hour concerts to be heard each Saturday at 7 p. m., beginning Oct. 19.

The Cleveland orchestra, entering its 29th season, has planned an extensive series of appearances which will include 20 pairs of symphony concerts constituting the regular season, the summer "pops," the "twilights" and the children's concerts.

Susan Hayward will have John Hodiak as her new leading man when her current screen hit, "Canyon Passage," is given its world radio premiere on "This Is Hollywood" at 10:15 p. m. A thrilling story of pioneer days in Oregon in the 1850s, the picture starred Miss Hayward and Dana Andrews. Hedda Hopper, noted Hollywood columnist, will contribute behind-the-scenes anecdotes about the two guests and about the making of the film.

"The Adventure of Black Angus," a Scottish werewolf or vampire, intrigues "Sherlock Holmes" over ABC at 9:30 p. m., and he goes on a search for a disappearing bridegroom when the latter's bride advises him that the husband-to-be has been abducted by the vampire.

Vera Vague, the man-chasing comedienne of the Bob Hope show, will display some of her own spe-

cial comedy material, and Randy Brooks, trumpet-toting bandleader, will contribute a horn solo when they guest star on the Vaughn Monroe show at 7:30 p. m. over CBS.

Richard Tucker, Metropolitan Opera tenor, will co-star with prima donna Marion Claire in a presentation of the lighthearted operetta of love and springtime, "Appleblossom," on the "Chicago Theatre of the Air" at 10 p. m. over Mutual.
