

Clark Gable Defends Choice As Star in 'The Hucksters'

Clark Gable, cinema king of many a year, rises in righteous wrath to defend his claim to "The Hucksters" leading role against the onslaughts of George Burns and Gracie Allen during the Thursday broadcast at 8:30 p. m. over NBC.

Jan Peerce, of radio and Metropolitan Opera fame, will make the first of 10 starring appearances on "The Treasure Hour of Song," over the Mutual chain at 9:30 p. m. On the premiere broadcast Peerce will sing the famous Vesti La Giubba from "Pagliacci," with Alfredo Antonini conducting the orchestra. Besides being heard in solo, Peerce

also will join his guest artist of the evening, Soprano Licia Albanese, in an operatic duet.
