Greer Garson and Walter Pidgeon will recreate their original screen roles when they appear in "Mrs. Parkington" on the Radio theatre at 9 p. m. Monday over CBS.

Howard Barlow will play the "March" from "Aida" to note the 73rd anniversary of the American premiere of the Verdi opera and he will have Christopher Lynch as guest soloist on the "Voice of Firestone" program at 8:30 p. m. over NBC.

Bois Karloff will star in the Screen Guild Players production of "Arsenic and Old Lace" at 10 p. m. over CBS. The story is based on the very successful play by Howard Lindsay and Russell Crouse in which Karloff appeared during a long run on the New York stage. It is a weird and
