Playground Tieup With Parking Lot Dangerous, City Told

Lloyd Mohr, president of the city park commission, told three city council committees Monday night that he "didn't like the idea" of combining a playground with a parking lot because, he held, it would be dangerous to children.

Mohr reported that the commission has not acted, so far, on the city plan commission's request to determine how much of the Amoth playground, near Atwood ave., could be spared for parking purposes.

A committee of East Side business men, who have proposed that adjoining property be purchased for additional parking space, appeared before the property, municipal service, and finance committees.

They were informed by Mayor Kraege that the committees will act on the East Side recommendation when the park commission submits its report.

The committee included H. C. Schenk, L. L. Lunenschloss, L. S. Lunder, and Olaf Strand.

Fines, Bails Set Record of \$1,867.70 in Day

Police "business" before Superior Judge Roy H. Proctor Monday yielded \$1,867.70 in fines and bails forfeited, the largest amount received on any court day this year and one of the largest in the court's history.

There were 46 cases heard by the judge, including four grand larcenies, two cases of pool-selling in regard to the football parlay ticket racket, one case of a man taking indecent liberties with minors, eight disorderly conducts, and four drunken drivers.

The total included only 12 other traffic cases besides the drunken drivers, an unusually small number for Monday morning traffic court.
