Organized in July

Although the bureau—organized in July by the Most Rev. William P. O'Connor, Catholic bishop of Madison, and licensed by the state Aug. 6—offers help to adults with personal or family problems; it is primarily concerned at present with child welfare, he noted. The family welfare program will be expanded as the staff is enlarged.

In aiding children, the bureau's case workers try to keep them in their own homes whenever possible and to reunite families quickly when they must be temporarily separated, Fr. van Handel explained.

"Placing of such children in homes other than their own or in an institution is usually only a temporary measure," he added, appealing for more Catholic parents in the diocese to offer to board children for such brief periods.
