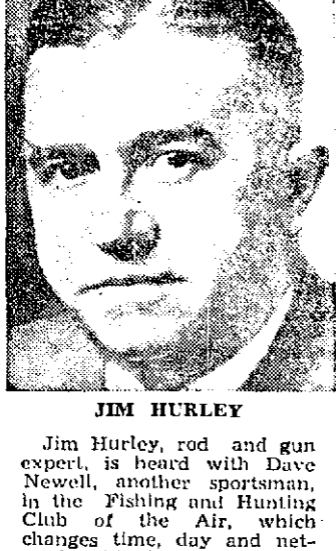


Tonight's Aces
