State Refuses To Return Liquor

COLUMBUS; Dec. 26 - (AP)-The state liquor department held firm today against efforts by Chicago attorneys to obtain return of a shipment of liquor recently seized by its agents near Van Wert, "I told them I would give them nothing and that I would agree to nothing," said State Liquor Director Robert M. Sohngen, "I told them to sue us."
