# Foster to Plead Innocent in Death of Ex-Gratiot Man

LOS ANGELES —(U.P.)— Roy G. Foster, 64, was arraigned today on a charge of murdering his son-in-law on Christmas day, and his attorney said he would plead innocent.

Superior Judge Thomas L. Ambrose, after reading the charges against the elderly Idaho resident, ordered him to appear Jan. 28 to enter his plea on the accusation that he murdered John Oswald Ganshert, 38, formerly of Gratiot.

Atty. L. Gelber said that when she brings Foster into court on that date she will have him plead not guilty on the grounds that he was defending his family and his home when he fatally shot his daughter's husband.
