Frank E. French, 47, a veteran of two wars, swore "before me and my God" that he was not responsible for the death of his dark-haired, attractive wife, 45-

and New York.
Police said that French's account of his activities between
midnight Sunday and the discovery of the body Monday morning
showed 'major discrepancies."
