1. Subsection (46) of section 16.03 of the General Ordinances of the City of Madison entitled "Districts and Map" is hereby created to read as follows:

"16.03 (46). The following described property is hereby omitted from "C" Residence District and added to "D" Residence District:

Lots Ten (10) and Eleven (11), Block Ninety-six (96), Original Plat, City of Madison."

2. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage and publication and in accordance with the provisions of section 16.19 of the General Ordinances of the City of Madison.
