Information for Veterans

(From VA, 44b State St.)

Q. Will the time spent in the army count towards federal civil service retirement?

A. Yes. However, to obtain full retirement monetary benefits when retirement age is reached the employe must deposit in CSR fund an amount equal to that which would have been deducted from his civil service salary had he not been on active duty with the army.

Q. To qualify for death pension benefits, how long after hostilities terminate must a veteran's widow have been married to the deceased?

A. The widow of a World War II veteran must have been married to the veteran prior to the expiration of 10 years subsequent to the termination of hostilities incident to World War II to be eligible for pension benefits.

Q. Where a veteran has received the combat infantry badge, but through error did not receive the pay attached thereto, how can he apply for same after discharge?

A. All inquiries regarding adjustments on army pay should be addressed to: The Army Central Adjustment office, 4300 Goodfellow blvd., St. Louis 20, Mo.

Q. How does an employer apply for certification to hire veterans under the GI bill on-the-job training program?

A. Any employer may submit a training program to the apprenticeship division of the Wisconsin state industrial commission. If it is approved by that office, he can be certified as an employer under the GI bill.

Q. In order for a disabled veteran to continue to receive disability pension must he be examined periodically by a Veterans Administration medical department?

A. Yes, any disabled veteran may be called in by the Veterans Administration at any time for a medical examination. Failure to report for such examination without good reason results in suspension of pension.
