**BOND SALE**  
\$90,000 Water and Sewer Bonds of the Village of Niagara, Wisconsin  
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Village of Niagara, Marinette County, Wisconsin, will receive bids for the purchase of the following bonds of said Village:

\$90,000 Water and Sewer Bonds to pay the cost of constructing a combined, unified system of water mains, sewers and drains for said Village, dated February 1, 1947, denomination \$5,000, due serially on February 1 of each of the years 1948 to 1965, inclusive, bonds numbered from 15 to 18, inclusive, being optional in inverse numerical order at par on August 1, 1947, or on any interest payment date thereafter.

Principal and interest on said bonds are payable at the office of the Village Treasurer, Niagara, Wisconsin. The maximum rate of interest to be borne by the bonds is two per cent (2%) per annum, payable August 1, 1947, and semi-annually thereafter. All interest rates bid must be in multiples of one-fourth of one per cent, and no bid shall specify more than one rate of interest which shall apply to the entire issue, and no bid will be considered for less than all of the bonds of said issue. All other things being equal, preference will be given to the bid of par and accrued interest, or better, which specifies the lowest coupon interest rate.

Bids must be accompanied by a certified check on a state or national bank in the amount of \$2,000, payable to the Village Treasurer of the Village of Niagara, Wisconsin, as a guarantee of good faith, to be forfeited to said Village by the successful bidder as liquidated damages should he fail to take up and pay for the bonds when ready.

Said bonds shall be the direct general obligations of the Village of Niagara and are being issued subject to the approving opinions of the Attorney General of the State of Wisconsin, and Messrs. Chapman and Cutler, Attorneys, of Chicago, Illinois, which opinions will be furnished without cost to the successful bidder. The purchaser shall furnish the printed bonds at his own expense.

Sealed bids should be addressed to the undersigned Village Clerk, Niagara, Wisconsin, and will be received up to 3:00 o'clock P. M., March 25, 1947, and oral bids will be received at The Niagara High School Building in said Village at that time.

The right is reserved to reject any or all bids.
