AN ORDINANCE

By Alderman Leo Straus:
An Ordinance to create subsection (52) of section 16.03 of the General Ordinances of the City of Madison entitled "Districts and Map" and being a part of the chapter entitled "Zoning and City Planning."

The Common Council of the City of Madison do ordain as follows:

1. Subsection (52) of section 16.03 of the General Ordinances of the City of Madison is created to read as follows:

"16.03 (52). The following described property is hereby omitted from Residence "B" District and added to Commercial "A" District:

Lot Three (3), Block One (1), North Gardens, City of Madison."

2. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage and publication and in accordance with the provisions of section 16.18 of the General Ordinances of the City of Madison.
