IN THE MATTER of establishing regulations governing the taking of fish in the waters of Weber lake (Firefly lake) in Vilas county, Wisconsin. Section 1. WHEREAS, in accordance with the power and authority delegated to the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by virtue of and pursuant to the provisions of Sections 23.09 (7) and 29.174 of the Wisconsin statutes, the said State Conservation Commission caused investigations, studies and experiments to be made relative to the supply of fish and the methods to be used in managing the fish population in Weber lake (Firefly Lake), and

Section 2. WHEREAS, upon the evidence presented as a result of such investigations, studies and experiments, the said State Conservation Commission finds and determines that in order to obtain additional information it is necessary to conduct additional experiments in fish management and that the rules and regulations set forth herein shall apply to the taking of fish in the waters of Weber lake (Firefly lake) in Vilas county, Wisconsin.

Section 3. NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND DECLARED by the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin, by virtue of and pursuant to the provisions of Sections 23.09 (7) and 29.174 of the Wisconsin statutes, that it shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch or kill fish or fish for fish in any manner in the waters of Weber lake (Firefly lake) situated in Sections 28 and 33, Township 41 N., Range 7 E., all in Vilas county, Wisconsin, except under the following conditions:

1. There shall be an open season for taking rainbow trout in the waters of Weber lake (Firefly lake) in Vilas county from May 17 to September 7, both dates inclusive. Fishing in such waters shall be authorized only under permit which may be secured at the Trout lake forestry headquarters.
2. Fishing in such waters shall be permitted only from one-half hour before sunrise until one hour after sunset.
3. There shall be a bag limit on such fish of five fish per day with a minimum size limit of seven inches.
4. All fish taken pursuant to this order shall be exhibited to the Conservation Commission or its agents at the Trout Lake Forestry headquarters for examination.
5. It shall be unlawful to use minnows of any variety for bait while fishing in such waters.

Section 4. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this order shall be, upon approval of the Governor, and after publication in the official state paper, namely, the Wisconsin State Journal of Madison, Wisconsin, and in the Vilas County News Review of Eagle River, Wisconsin, effective beginning May 17, 1947.

Section 5. THIS ORDER was made and passed by the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin at a meeting duly called and held by said commission in the city of Madison, state of Wisconsin, this 11th day of March, 1947.

Section 6. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Director of the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin is authorized by said commission to validate this order by signing the same.
