Farmers in Favor of Atomic Bomb

DES MOINES, Ia.—(U.P.)—More than three-fourths of American farmers believe the United States should continue making atomic bombs for defense, a survey by the magazine Successful Farming revealed.

Only 18 per cent of those interviewed favor stopping bomb production and destroying those already produced, the magazine said.

The survey showed that the farmers interviewed believed atomic bomb secrets should be withheld from Russia.

"Views of an overwhelming majority point out that Russia would not allow a United Nations committee to investigate her country, even if the United States did destroy its bombs and stop production," the magazine said.
