### Fourth of U.S. Dry, WCTU Head Claims

ASBURY PARK, N. J.—(U.P.)—
One-fourth of the United States either is dry or bans hard liquor and eight more states soon may be added to the list, Mrs. D. Leigh Colvin, president of the National WCTU, said Thursday.

Mrs. Colvin, of Evanston, Ill., said 500 communities were added to prohitition ranks in 1946 by local option and that drys were organizing to submit the question of statewide prohition to the voters of Alabama, Arkansas, North

"Sentiment for statewide prohibition also is developing in a Georgia, Kentucky, South Carolina, and Tennessee," she told the 73rd annual convention of the national WCTU.
