## Fourth of U. S. Dry, WCTU Head Claims

ASBURY PARK, N. J.—(U.P.)—One-fourth of the United States either is dry or bans hard liquor and eight more states soon may be added to the list, Mrs. D. Leigh Colvin, president of the National WCTU, said Thursday.

Mrs. Colvin, of Evanston, Ill., said 500 communities were added to prohibition ranks in 1946 by local option and that dries were organizing to submit the question of statewide prohibition to the voters of Alabama, Arkansas, North Carolina, and Texas.

"Sentiment for statewide prohibition also is developing in Georgia, Kentucky, South Carolina, and Tennessee," she told the 73rd annual convention of the national WCTU.

## House Group Votes Security Tax Repeat

WASHINGTON — (U.P.) — The house ways and means committee Wednesday unanimously approved a bill to freeze social security payroll taxes at the present rate of 1 per cent on both employers and employes through 1949.

Under present law the rates are scheduled to go up to 2½ per cent next Jan. 1.

The committee also approved a new formula for computing social security taxes after 1949. The rates will be increased to 1½ per cent in 1950 and two per cent in 1957.
