### BOND SALE

\$400,000 Sewer Bonds of the City of Marshfield, Wood County, Wisconsin. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City of Marshfield, Wood County, Wisconsin, will receive sealed bids only for the purchase of \$400,000 Sewer Bonds of said City, dated July 1, 1947, denomination \$1,000 each, due serially \$40,000 on July 1 of each of the years 1953, to 1962, inclusive, but subject to redemption at par at the option of the City of Marshfield in direct numerical order on July 1, 1952 or on any interest payment date thereafter. Said bonds are being issued to construct and establish a sewage disposal plant and intercepting sewers for said city. Principal and interest on said bonds shall be payable at the office of the City Treasurer, Marshfield, Wisconsin, or at Citizens National Bank or Central State Bank, Marshfield, Wisconsin.

Said bonds will be sold at not less than par and accrued interest, the maximum rate of interest to be borne by the bonds to be 3%, payable January 1, 1948, and semi-annually thereafter. All interest rates bid must be in multiples of 1/4 of 1%, the same rate of interest to apply to the entire issue. All other things being equal, preference will be given to the bid of par and accrued interest, or better, which specifies the lowest coupon interest rate.

Sealed bids should be addressed to E. H. Olson, City Clerk, Marshfield, Wisconsin, and will be received up to 7:30 o'clock p. m., July 7, 1947. Bids must be accompanied by a certified check on a state or national bank, in the amount of \$10,000 made payable to the City Treasurer of the City of Marshfield, Wisconsin, as a guarantee of good faith, to be forfeited as liquidated damages to said City by the successful bidder should he fail to take up and pay for the bonds when ready.

Said bonds will be the direct general obligations of said City and are being issued subject to the favorable opinion of Messrs. Chapman and Cutler,
