## LEGAL NOTICES

STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION  
OF WISCONSIN  
Order No. M-171  
(Revise 4)

IN THE MATTER of rescinding State Conservation Commission Order No. M-171 (Revise 3) and establishing emergency regulations pertinent to the special governing of the use of fire in any manner in certain forest and marsh areas of Wisconsin

Section 1. WHEREAS, in accordance with the power and authority delegated to the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by and under the provisions of subsection (7) of section 23.09 of the Wisconsin statutes and more particularly under paragraphs (i) and (j) of said subsection, the aforesaid State Conservation Commission, on its own motion, has caused due examination and investigation to be made of the existing dryness of various forms of vegetation, dead wood and leaves within the boundaries of the Forest Protection Districts, and on account of such dryness verily believes that regulations should be passed by the State Conservation Commission prohibiting the use of fire in such districts except under certain conditions and for the period of time designated in section 4 of this order, and

Section 2. WHEREAS, upon the evidence presented as a result of such investigations and examinations the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin does hereby find and determine that it is reasonably necessary, in order to prevent forest and marsh fires within the boundaries of the Forest Protection Districts, to establish the regulations that it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to build a camp fire of any nature except at authorized improved camp grounds or places of habitation unless he first obtains a special permit from a duly authorized and appointed district forest ranger or other person delegated similar authority by the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin; and further, that it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to smoke in any manner, any pipe, cigarette or cigar except at places of habitation, authorized improved camp grounds or in any automobile or vehicle operating on state or county highways, and that such automobile or vehicle shall be equipped on the inside of the body of such automobile or vehicle in each and every instance with a receptacle that will serve as an ash container; and further, that it shall be unlawful at all times for any person or persons to throw or cause to be thrown from such automobile or vehicle any matches, ashes, burning tobacco, or other burning material on or within the boundaries of the Forest Protection Districts; and further, it shall be un-
