Royal Wedding Broadcasts to Start 5 A. M. on Thursday

The three major networks in this area will go on the air earlier than usual Thursday, to provide a full description of the wedding of Princess Elizabeth and Lt. Philip Mountbatten in London.

Starting at 5 a. m. (11 a. m. London time), the broadcast will last approximately two hours. Radio correspondents at vantage points inside Westminster Abbey and along the mile-long route the wedding party will take are to describe the color and pomp of the occasion.

Princess Elizabeth and her cottage are to leave Buckingham Palace and move down the Mall, through the Admiralty Arch down Whitehall, and around Parliament Square to the west entrance of the Abbey. Lt. Mountbatten will proceed privately from Marlborough House to the door way.

The ceremony is expected to last an hour. After signing the royal register at Westminster, the couple will return to Buckingham palace by the route followed by the princess earlier. Upon their arrival at the palace, they are to greet well-wishers from the balcony.
