The City Council of the City of Madison do ordain as follows:

1. Subsection (70) of section 16.03 of the General Ordinances of the City of Madison entitled "Districts and Map" is created to read as follows:

"16.03 (70). The following described property is hereby omitted from Residence "A" District and added to Residence "B" District:

Lots Fourteen (14) to Twenty-seven (27), inclusive, Block Thirty (30), and Lots One (1) to Sixteen (16), inclusive, Block-Thirty-one (31), Fair Oaks Addition, City of Madison."

2. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage and publication.
