Geologist Says Arctic May Yield Oil

LARAMIE, Wyo. —(UP)— A forecast that oil may be discovered in the Arctic region has been made by a geologist at the University of Wyoming here. The geologist is Ray Thompson, who spent the summer doing oil exploration in the frozen north, and who has just completed a report to the navy on his work in the western part of the naval oil reserve No. 4. His belief is backed by the fact that appropriations have been made to finance oil exploration in Alaska until 1950.
