Oshkosh Firm Asks Injunction Against WERB

E. M. Alstad, clerk of the Madison federal court, announced today that a hearing will be held before Judge Patrick Stone here Tuesday on motion for a permanent injunction against the Wisconsin employment relations board (WERB).

A temporary injunction order was signed by Stone in Wausau late Wednesday at the request of the Bell Machine Co., Oshkosh, restraining the state board from holding an election and an investigation of alleged unfair labor practices requested by employes of the Oshkosh firm. The petitioning employes are represented by a local of the United Auto Workers, Region 9, AFL.
