Hogs: 6,500 market slow, later trade moderately active. Prices uneven. Top 23.25, sparingly. Bulk good and choice 180 to 230 lbs. 22.50 to 23. Good and choice 240 to 260 lbs. 21.00 to 22.25; 270 to 290 pounds 19.75 to 20.75; 300-375 pounds 18.75 to 19.50. Most good and choice 350-550 lbs. sows 17.25 to 18.25. Cattle: 8,000. Calves: 800.

Slaughter steers and heifers slow. About steady except good to choice steers 1,200 pounds and up weak to 50 cents lower. Cows steady to a quarter lower. Bulls active to 25 cents higher. Tops 31.75 for two loads choice, 1134 pound feed steers. Most good to low choice steers 25.25 to 28.50. Medium to low choice 23 to 25. Good and choice heifers 24.50 to 27.25. Common and medium cows 18.00 to 20.50. A few good cows up to 22.50. Caners ad cutters 14.50 to 17.50. Bulk medium weight and heavy bulls 22.25 to 23.00. A few sausage ready to 23.25. Beef bulls 23.50. Vealers steady at \$28.00 down. Stocker and feeder steers fairly active, steady. Sheep: 3,500. Not established. Some early slaughter lambs bids lower. Still asked fully steady or 22.85 or better for best woolled lambs. Indications some order buyer demand.
