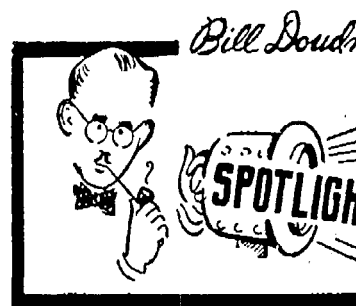

Unpublicized crises innumerable. Rented mimeograph machines fail at critical moments. Hotel elevators mobbed to inaccessibility. Switchboards with broadcasting trunks go blank just before airtime. Lights fail when newsmen are writing scripts, necessitating candlelight. Teletype machines "bust in the middle of important bulletins.

Philly traffic jams incredible, requiring last-minute broadcasting changes. NBC Commentator W. W. Chaplin had two press conferences within an hour which necessitated climbing a total of 49 flights of stairs in four buildings. Lost 12 pounds in single day.

NBC is paying Bellevue-Stratford hotel, big convention center, \$5 per day to rent a linen closet being used for television control room. During Bob Trout's first tel cast, the sink overflowed and Trout worked ankle-deep in water.

Just before another convention hall telecast, Ben Grauer needed a shave but no mirrors available and washroom was mobbed. So Grauer had a television set and camera hooked up, was televised, shaved while looking at his image.

Philly is television mad. Bars, stores, NBC headquarters mobbed by viewers from all over Philly. Two greatest television scoops and talk of industry were NBC's telecast of Dewey's press conference, a notable first, and NBC's
