CAPE GIRARDEAU, Mo. During 12 hours of Aug. 5, a 380-acre farm which has been cropped continuously since Miscropped continuously since Missouri became a state in 1821 will have its face lifted.

It will be "soil security day" and in those 12 hours the worn farm, owned by the Hope Broth-

ers, will be modernized.

There will be construction of contours on the rolling hills. A

big farm pond will be dug. Wildlife and forestry experts will plant cover crops and mark the trees for cutting.

They will watch the face-lifting operations from a ridge which runs the length of the project.
