Old Missouri Farm to Get New Look

CAPE GIRARDEAU, Mo. — (UP)—During 12 hours of Aug. 5, a 380-acre farm which has been cropped continuously since Missouri became a state in 1821 will have its face lifted.

It will be "soil security day" and in those 12 hours the worn farm, owned by the Hope Brothers, will be modernized.

There will be construction of contours on the rolling hills. A big farm pond will be dug. Wildlife and forestry experts will plant cover crops and mark the trees for cutting.

The day, dream child of business men who have become conservation-minded in recent years, is expected to bring thousands of interested spectators to the farm, 17 miles north of here. They will watch the face-lifting operations from a ridge which runs the length of the project.
