The Madison housing center received 170 new applications for housing in July, the Madison Authority (MHA) reported today, and with 153 families unsettled from the preceding month had 323 applications on hand Aug. 1. Of the new applications, 127

The center had 99 housing units available July 1 of which 91 were single rooms, and added 56 list-ings during the month, of which 28 were single rooms and 28 Water bouckeeping apartments. light houskeeping apartments, two furnished apartments, and six cottages and houses. During the month 83 units were rented, including 50 rooms, 25 and
