## 170 More Apply for Housing in July

The Madison housing center received 170 new applications for housing in July, the Madison Authority (MHA) reported today, and with 153 families unsettled from the preceding month had 323 applications on hand Aug. 1.

Of the new applications, 127 came from veterans.

The center had 99 housing units available July 1 of which 91 were single rooms, and added 56 listings during the month, of which 28 were single rooms and 28 light housekeeping apartments, two furnished apartments, and six cottages and houses.

During the month 83 units were rented, including 50 rooms, 25 light housekeeping apartments, and all but one of the houses and furnished apartments. One house trailer also was rented.

Available Aug. 1 were 72 units, including 69 rooms and two light housekeeping units.

Of the units rented, only 10 allowed children.

## Young GOP Backing Immell Faces Ouster

MILWAUKEE — (U.P.) — John F. Mills, president of the Milwaukee County Young Republican organization, today said an attempt will be made to oust an executive committeeman who is supporting Ralph M. Immell for governor.

Mills said he believed the organization has grounds to oust William Kasik, treasurer of the new Young Republican Alliance for Immell for governor.

Mills said Kasik had "no right to endorse any candidate" because the Young Republican organization had voted against endorsements.

## Married Hired Men Want Own Farms

AMES, Ia. — (U.P.) — Most married hired men would like to be farming for themselves, an Iowa State college survey shows.

The survey was taken by Robert Rohwer, rural sociologist at Iowa State. He said that in 1940, more than half of the 20,000 hired farm hands in Iowa were married, and that the number has increased since then.

Hired men feel that even in these days of high wages they cannot save enough to make an unassisted start in farming on their own, Rohwer said.
