\*\*Jack Lathrop and Drugstore Cowboys (Victor): "Hair of Gold" and "You Call Everybody Darlin'" . . . Lots of originality in this purposely-corny pairing.

\*Count Basie (Victor): "Ready, Set, Go!" and "Seventh Ave. Express" . . . Second side is a parade of good solos. First is a medium-jump novelty.

\*\*Tony Martin (Victor): "This Is the Moment" and "Ah But It Happens" . . . If you like 'em sweet, this is for you.

\*\*Dinah Shore (Columbia): "Love That Boy" and "This Is the Moment" . . . The clever first side is a dandy; the second isn't up Dinah's aisle.

\*Frankie Carle (Columbia): "I Don't Want to Meet Any More People," vocal by Marjorie Hughes, and "That 5 O'Clock Feeling," vocal by Nan Wright . . . Instrumental work is classy, but the vocals don't do right by either side.
