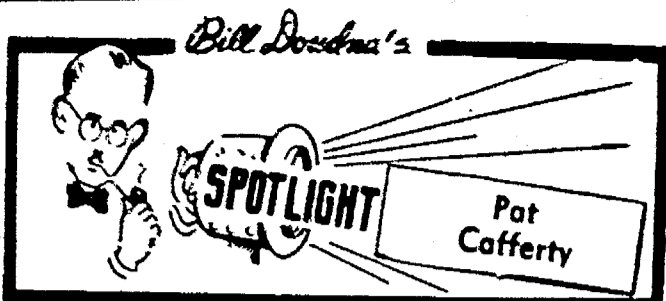

At season's end, the whole company came to Madison for a weekend at the Cafferty home before separating.

**RADIO:** A last-minute shuffle of NBC's Tuesday lineup will add "Big Town" to the schedule, with Bob Hope's show moving to an earlier spot than last season. "Big Town" will be on the air at 8 and 9 p. m. and Hope at 7 and 8 p. m., beginning Sept. 14.
