HIGH POINT: Cuddles Sakall, whose pumpernickel accent is effective as ever.

LOW POINTS: A too-familiar

plot, burdened with unoriginal dialogue. Clark's hard-working but unconvincing acting slow-moving, dragged-out scenes with the feel of drama conspicuous by its absence.

VERDICT: A large egg.
