ABC Sets New Limits on Radio Commercials
 NEW YORK — (U.P.) — Mark Woods, president of the American Broadcasting Co. (ABC), Wednesday announced changes in network policies limiting the time of commercials.

The new policies limits maximum time for advertising to one minute for a five-minute program, two minutes for a 10 minute program, scaled upward to six minutes for a one hour program between the hours of 6 p. m. and 11 p. m.

Daytime commercial broadcasts were limited to a slightly longer period—one minute, 15 seconds for a five-minute program, scaled up to seven minutes for a full hour program.
