WHA, which has been broadcasting until 5:15 p. m., signs off at 4:30 p. m. during November and December.  
Federal Communications Commission (FCC) regulations require the station to go off the air at sunset because WHA is licensed for day-time broadcasting only. The commission designates the "legal sunset" time, which changes the signing off schedule, several times a year.  
This does not affect WHA-FM, which continues to broadcast until 10:35 each night.
