8:30—KFI—Stanley Noonan, young San Francisco baritone, will be the guest soloist with Pierre Monteux and the San Francisco Symphony Orchestra on the Standard Hour.

9:30—KHJ—Johann Strauss' gay operetta "Die Fledermaus" will be presented tonight by the "Chicago Theater of the Air." The hour-long program has been specially adapted for radio presentation.
