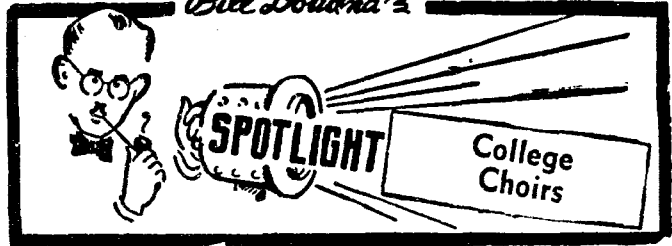

the 50 voices. This choir is unusual in that all members are required to take voice lessons throughout the year and to attend daily rehearsals. The chorus has sung with the Minneapolis Symphony orchestra.

The Wartburg choir of Wartburg college, Waverly, Ia., will give a concert at 8 p. m. Tuesday in St. John's Lutheran church. Judy Vogel, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George Vogel, Madison, is a member of the organization.

The University of Wisconsin Men's chorus will present its annual concert at 8 p. m. Sunday, Mar. 27, in the Wisconsin Union theater. Prof. Bjornar Bergethon is conductor. Tickets are on sale at the theater boxoffice.

Clemency Asked for Life Termer

Atty. Laurence W. Hall, Madison, asked for executive clemency Wednesday afternoon for James Riley, Marshall, who was given a life term at Waupun in 1943 by a Dane county circuit court jury for first degree murder.

Riley shot his girl friend, Gladys Olson, while they were riding about in his car, and then took the body to the Madison police station.

Gov. Rennebohm's pardon counsel, Atty. Timothy Brown, heard the clemency request. Letters from the prison physician and psychiatrist pointed out that Riley had "matured" since his confinement and was unlikely to commit further crimes. His prison record showed no misconduct in six years.
