STORY: This is a story of house and its effect on two separate generations that lived in it. Grizel Dane, Pelham's granddaughter and an American ambulance driver, comes to it and finds Roland, who has returned to spend his last days there, and Proutie, his aged servant. War-time circumstances also bring Pax, Lark's nephew, to the old Dane home.

Roland evades Grizel's questions regarding the house and Lark but eventually the story is revealed of how she came there as a child as Roland's father's ward, was hated by Selina, who had been given charge of the

house when her mother died, and was loved by both Roland and Pelham.

Interwoven with the story of the love of Lark and Roland, as it is told in flashbacks, is the modern love story of Grizel and Pax, which almost ends in the same unhappy way . . . but doesn't.

HIGH POINTS: The story itself . . . the use of things in the house to connect the past with the present . . . excellent acting by all, particularly Jayne Meadows as the selfish and embittered sister and Niven as the aged Roland . . . Gigi Perreau's portrayal of Lark as a child.

LOW POINTS: None, with the possible exception of a somewhat confusing beginning.

VERDICT: A really excellent adult movie that is "enchantment" in itself.

INTERESTING EXTRA: "Beauty and the Blade," a short on figure skating featuring today's champions in the art.
