Reformed church at New Glarus. He will take the place of the Rev. W. J. Stuckey, who is ill.

Mr. Waddell is with the Mills brothers circus, which will be in Madison on June 28.

The show will spend Sunday and Monday in New Glarus, but in accordance with its custom will give no Sabbath performances. It will present two shows Monday under auspices of the New Glarus Lions club.

Magazine photographers will visit Mills brothers' show at New Glarus, too, taking pictures of Mr. Waddell's Sunday school for children of circus performers and employes.

The 85-year-old pastor is observing his 78th anniversary as a showman. His life story appears in the July issue of Coronet magazine.
