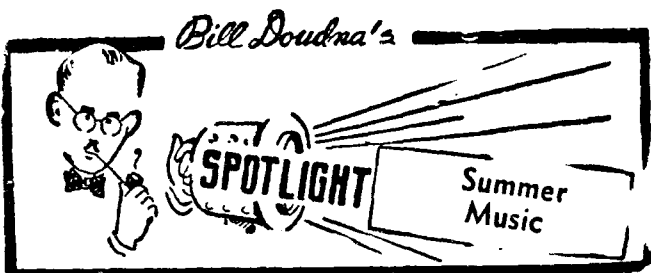

The Summer Session chorus, directed by Paul G. Jones, will give a concert at 8 p. m. Aug. 17 in Music hall. Claire Richards and Leo Steffens will present a two-piano recital at 8 p. m. July 27 in Music hall, and Helen Boatwright will sing at 8 p. m. Aug. 3 in Music hall.

Church will conduct the Summer Symphony orchestra in a concert at 8 p. m. July 31 in the Wisconsin Union theater, and Walter and Emil Heermann will join Miss Richards in a cello-violin-piano program at 8 p. m. Aug. 10 in Music Hall.
