## Hawaii Senate Drafts Anti-Strike Measure

HONOLULU —(P)— The territorial senate was working Thursday on a bill for permanent outlawing of strikes against the government.

The bill also would ban secondary boycotts and union "hot cargo" action against government operations.

In general it would make permanent such provisions of the emergency dock seizure act, under which the territorial government is attempting to end the present stevedore strike. The seizure act, putting the government in the stevedore business, is good for only 180 days.
