## JUST HAVING BREAKFAST

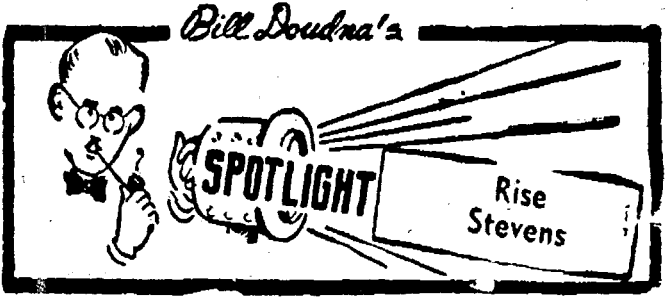

Miss Stevens will sing "Where'er You Walk." Handel: "IL Est Doux, IL Est Bon." Massenet; "Oh, Doux a Beautiful City;" "Were You There?"; "My Good Lord Done Been Here;" "Widmung." Schumann, "Traum Durch die Dammerung." Strauss: "Meine Liebe Ist Grun," Brahms: "Das Verlassene Magdelein" and "Mausfallen-Spruchlein," Wolf; "To the Children." Rachmaninoff; "April." St. Leger; "The Ash Grove." Grieg; "An Ocean Idyll." Smith, and Bizet's "Habanera," "Seguidilla," and "Gypsy Dance."

Brooks Smith, who wrote "An Ocean Idyll," will be Miss Stevens' accompanist. He will play one group of numbers on the program—"Sonata in A Major," Scarlatti; "Evening in Granada," Debussy, and "Capriccio in F Minor," Dohnanyi.

On The Air: Macdonald Carey, movie star who was a pre-medical student at the University of Wisconsin in 1931, will be featured in a radio version of "The Virginian" on WBBM at 9 tonight.
