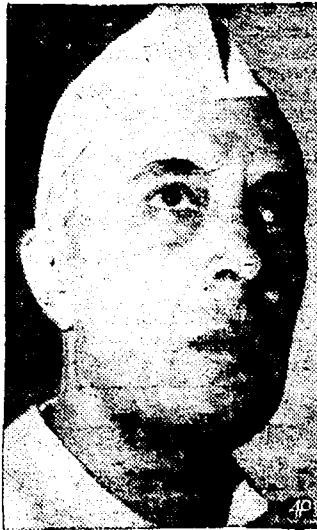

Dr. Bull Urges Fluorine Use for Urban Waters

SAN FRANCISCO — Immediate fluorination of all urban water supplies to prevent dental decay was urged here Tuesday afternoon by Dr. Francis A. Bull, Madison, Wis., director of dental health in the Wisconsin state board of health.

Dr. Bull reported, in a paper read before the research section of the American Dental assn., that nine Wisconsin cities including Madison, have added fluorine to their water in a ratio of one part per million.
