DuPont Grants \$10,000 in Fellowships to UW

Three fellowships totaling almost \$10,000 have been awarded to the University of Wisconsin by the DuPont Co.

Selection of candidates and work problems are left to the university, the company said.

One of the six post-doctoral \$3,000 fellowships in chemistry will go to a Wisconsin student for the next academic year. The university is to receive a \$1,500 award.

In chemistry, one of 45 post-graduate fellowships and one of 15 post-graduate fellowships in chemical engineering, will go to Wisconsin students. The fellowship provides \$1,200 for a single person or \$1,800 for a married person, together with an award of \$1,000 to the university.

A total of 47 universities are to share in the awards.
