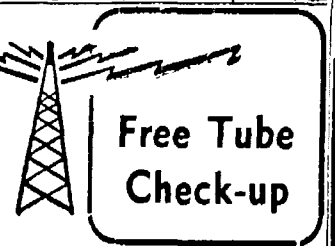

Policyholders Set All-Time Health Mark

NEW YORK—(AP)—Life insurance policyholders appear to have set an all-time health record in 1949, the Institute of Life Insurance said Wednesday.

Available reports indicate the death rate among American policyholders will be at a new low and about 15 per cent under the rate of 10 years ago, the institute said.

Life insurance policies matured by death this year will total about 1,360,000, a record high. The increase reflects a greater number of policies owned and not an increased death rate, the institute said.
