## 10,000 Milwaukee City Employees Get Unintentional Bonus

MILWAUKEE — (U.P.) — Some 10,000 Milwaukee city employees will get an unintentional bonus because the city council counted on a rent boom.

Last November, the council passed a special \$10 cost of living bonus.

It had originally lopped \$10 from the bonus, acting on the bureau of labor statistics' report that the cost of living index had dipped about that amount.

But labor leaders said the council should bank on a 30 per cent rise as a result of the new state rent control law.

The council passed the \$10 bonus. But now the October index is out, showing the Milwaukee rents went up only 10 instead of 30 per cent.

"It appears that city employees got a good break," Budget Supervisor George Saffran said.

## Salesman Sues Railroad for Damages in Crash

Reeve Peerenboom, a Madison insurance salesman, filed suit in circuit court Thursday asking \$2,000 damages from the Milwaukee railroad for car damage and personal injuries received last Jan. 31 when his car was struck by a train near Burke.

Peerenboom claimed the train was traveling at a negligent speed and gave no warning at the crossing.
