Air Reservists Eligible for Duty

Air Force Reserve officers separated from the Air Force because of the recent defense cuts are now eligible for recall for three-year extended active duty tours in the Air Force Reserve Training Center program.

The Continental Air Command, in announcing the new move, said that of the 461 positions authorized in the program over 400 are still unfilled.

All U.S.A.F. Reserve officers separated from the service under provisions of either Air Force Letter 36-3 or 36-26 are eligible for the program openings with the exception of "category R" personnel.
