## B-36 Will Fly Over Saturday

While not a new sight to San Antonians, the Air Force Saturday will send one of its famed B-36 superbombers over the Alamo City in celebration of the first Armed Forces Day.

The B-36 will be one of eight to fan out over the U.S. with more than 200 cities on the flight routes to total more than 25,000 miles, the Associated Press reports.
