Russ Reject Swedish Protest on Ship Seizure

STOCKHOLM, Sweden—(AP)—Russia has rejected Sweden's protests against seizure of Swedish fishing vessels in international waters, the foreign office said Tuesday.

A sharp Russian reply contended the Swedish trawlers Larex and Marion, seized last February by the Russians, were in Soviet waters.

It implied the two captains lied about the incident.
